1. Who are the men closest to you shaping your walk with God?

Every man becomes like the company he keeps.

“Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm.” — Proverbs 13:20

Your circle determines your direction.

2. What qualities make a man trustworthy in your life?

Godly friendships are built on truth, not convenience.

“Two are better than one... For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow.” — Ecclesiastes 4:9–10

The right brother won’t let you stay down.

3. Have you ever settled for surface-level friendships?

Shallow connections can’t handle deep battles.

“As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another.” — Proverbs 27:17

Real sharpening requires real friction.

4. What keeps you from inviting other men into your struggles?

Pride convinces us isolation is strength.

“Confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed.” — James 5:16

Healing happens in honesty, not hiding.

5. When has a brother’s challenge helped you grow spiritually?

Accountability often feels uncomfortable—but it’s love in disguise.

8. Who are you intentionally investing in right now?

Strong men don’t just find brothers—they become one.
