

Reflective Questions for No Limits, Just Next Steps — Discipled by the World

1. Where do you feel “behind” in life right now?

Comparison makes progress look like failure.

“Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us.” — Hebrews 12:1

You’re not called to run *their* race—just yours.

2. How has focusing on how far you have to go kept you from taking the next step?

Overthinking the distance often paralyzes movement.

“Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.” — Psalm 119:105

God gives light for the next step, not the whole map.

3. Why do men tend to measure growth by speed instead of obedience?

We chase progress reports more than spiritual maturity.

“Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much.” — Luke 16:10

Faithfulness in small steps builds strength for bigger ones.

4. When was the last time you took a step without seeing the outcome?

Faith doesn’t start with certainty—it starts with surrender.

“For we walk by faith, not by sight.” — 2 Corinthians 5:7

Growth begins when control ends.

5. What keeps you from trusting that God’s timing is enough?

Impatience convinces us that delay means denial.
