

# Reflective Questions for Performance Christianity Is Real — Mask of Success

## 1. What drives you to keep performing for God instead of resting in Him?

Sometimes the need to *prove* replaces the call to *trust*.

“Be still, and know that I am God.” — Psalm 46:10

God’s approval can’t be earned through effort—it’s received through relationship.

## 2. When did serving God start feeling more like striving for Him?

It’s easy to confuse working *for* God with walking *with* God.

“Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.” — Matthew 11:28

Obedience was never meant to run on burnout.

## 3. What are you building that God never asked you to build?

Sometimes success hides disobedience under the cover of productivity.

“Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain.” — Psalm 127:1

Not everything that looks fruitful is faithful.

## 4. How do you respond when your worth feels tied to your results?

Failure shakes whatever foundation your identity rests on.

“For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.” — 1 Corinthians 3:11

Your value doesn’t fluctuate with performance—it’s fixed in Christ.

## 5. When was the last time you slowed down long enough to listen?

Silence exposes whether your schedule serves God or self.

“In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength.” — Isaiah 30:15

If you can’t stop, you may have forgotten who’s really in control.

## 6. What does your busyness reveal about who you trust most—you or God?

Hustle is often a disguise for hidden fear.

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.” — Proverbs 3:5

Performance says, “It’s up to me.” Faith says, “God’s already at work.”

**7. Have you mistaken productivity for spiritual maturity?**

Activity without intimacy produces exhaustion, not fruit.

“Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself...” — John 15:4

Fruitfulness is born from abiding, not achieving.

**8. Where do you need to trade striving for surrender this week?**

Peace begins where performance ends.

“My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.” — 2 Corinthians 12:9

God’s strength starts where your effort stops.
