

Reflective Questions for The Man You're Becoming — Discipled by the World

1. What kind of man is God shaping you into right now?

Transformation isn't about who you were, but who He's forming today.

"And we all... are being transformed into his image from one degree of glory to another." — 2 Corinthians 3:18

Growth is gradual but guaranteed.

2. What parts of your old self are hardest to let go of?

Old habits die slowly when they've defined your worth.

"Put off your old self... and put on the new self." — Ephesians 4:22–24

God can't fill hands still clinging to yesterday.

3. How do you respond when God's process feels uncomfortable?

Refining always includes friction.

"No discipline seems pleasant at the time... but later it yields a harvest of righteousness." — Hebrews 12:11

Discomfort is often divine development.

4. Where do you see evidence of quiet growth others may not notice?

Character grows in the soil of hidden faithfulness.

"The Father who sees in secret will reward you." — Matthew 6:6

Heaven notices what the crowd overlooks.

5. What relationships or habits are helping (or hindering) your transformation?

Becoming new requires pruning what no longer fits.

"Every branch that does bear fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit." — John 15:2

God cuts only what He plans to heal stronger.

6. When was the last time you thanked God for how far He's already brought you?

Gratitude fuels perseverance when progress feels slow.

“Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you.” — 1 Thessalonians 5:18

The man who remembers becomes the man who endures.

7. How does grace shape the man you’re becoming?

Grace doesn’t lower the standard—it changes the source of strength.

“But by the grace of God I am what I am.” — 1 Corinthians 15:10

You’re not earning growth; you’re receiving it.

8. What would it look like to cooperate with God’s work in you today?

Transformation is a partnership, not a performance.

“For it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.” — Philippians 2:13
