## 1. Where do you feel like you've fallen behind compared to other men?

Comparison is the silent thief of gratitude.

“Let each one test his own work... and not in comparison to someone else.” — Galatians 6:4  
God’s plan for you doesn’t need a benchmark.

## 2. How has the world taught you to measure success?

Culture rewards speed and results, not faithfulness.

“Man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart.” — 1 Samuel 16:7
